This is in response to your August 16 letter requesting a letter of compliance from the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) for your PR 20 Eave Catchguard.

As you know, OSHA does not endorse products nor issue formal letters of approval for products or work practices, but when provided with adequate information we can offer an opinion as to whether or not a product or work practice affords compliance with certain regulations. We have reviewed the test data, pictures, and instructional guidelines that you have submitted and it appears that if the PR 20 Eave Catchguard is installed as described, this system would meet or exceed OSHA's standards for fall protection at the eave of a roof.
